FORM:

## MAKE DO

- irregular verbs
- conjugated according to the normal rules for verbs

USE: It is hard to choose between these two verbs.
In general, "DO" is to perform, and "MAKE" is to create or to construct.
Example: The teacher makes up the exam and the student does it.
