

Wh-Questions: Where + Be

FORM:

Where + be + noun?

USE:

“**Where**” indicates or asks about someone’s or something’s **position, place** or **direction**. When we ask a question with “where”, there are two possible answers:

Where is Jane?

Jane is at home.

At home.

Where are the knives?

The knives are in the drawer.

In the drawer.

EXAMPLES: *Where is the boss?(conference room)* → *He’s in the conference room.*
The new computers are in the warehouse. → *Where are the new computers?*
