**ALL OTHER VERBS**  $\mathbf{BE}$ 

## FORM:

I am not	I'm not		I do not like	I don't like
You are not	You're not	You aren't	You do not like	You don't like
He is not	He's not	He isn't	He does not like	He doesn't
She is not	She's not	She isn't	She does not like	like
It is not	It's not	It isn't	It does not like	She doesn't
We are not	We're not	We aren't	We do not like	like

All Other Verbs: subject + do / does + not + base verb

**USE:** 

The simple present tells about habits and routines and tells about facts. Use the contractions "don't" and "doesn't" for negative statements in speaking or in informal writing. For formal writing, use the long form.

**NOTE:** In the third person singular (he / she / it), the verb after "does not" is E.g. He does not **drive** a car. never conjugated.

**EXAMPLES:** I play tennis. I don't play tennis.

*She eats chocolate every day. She doesn't eat chocolate every day.*
